Design Stage



Currently in the design stage for a 6-storey building with a total size of 9,800m².

This includes 4 lecture theatres, 5 large seminar rooms, 6 computer labs, 130 single staff offices, offices for 230 PhDs/ RAs and space for 20 visiting academic staff. There are also 3 research labs, MAGIC room and a new maker-space.

Social learning space- 310 informal spaces throughout building and 3 project rooms.

The total project cost is £39m with construction an estimated £23m.

There is a service redesign project working alongside the design team which is responsible for the business case, overseeing the move and ensuring the representation of users in all parts of the process.


Key facts about Abacws

Budget and timescale

Budget of £43.4m after contingency revised Construction value of £23m Total spend to date £38.4m, anticipated to be £39m

Construction programme ran from Nov 2019 to Aug 2021. Steel delayed by 12 days at the end of March 2020 but no other construction delays.





Transition from existing premises

Service Redesign project organised the transition over 5 weeks with full occupation before teaching commenced in October 2021.

Over 100 academic staff, 50 PS and Research staff and 110 PGR students moved office.

The transition included moving to the new University network.
